Four key features of learning

- Activation
- Exploration
- Reflection
- Action



Activation

- Surface prior knowledge
- Motivate
- Ignite curiosity



Exploration



- Active learning
- Hands-on/minds-on learning
- High Impact Practices (HIPs)

Reflection



- Confirm existing knowledge
- Expand understanding
- Modify misunderstanding

We do not learn from experience... we learn from reflecting on experience.







Action
